




Where is Mount Kilimanjaro?














- The major Cerebral Palsy (CP) charity in England and Wales. 1 in 400 babies born in the UK has CP.


Karibu - Welcome

(Kilimanjaro National Park) headquarters. Bureaucracy in paradise!

















The Saddle.

After beginning the summit climb at midnight, return to **Kibo Huts** at 9am. After tea and biscuits, another 10km hike back to **Horombo Huts!**




